

PWR fuel assemblies at Tokai Plant of Mitsubishi Nuclear Fuel Co. (MNF). Since the start of operation at the plant in January 1972, MNF has fabricated fuel assemblies for PWR nuclear power plants, achieving the shipment of a total of 9,000 units of fuel assemblies by last September. Fuel fabrication is underway, aiming at attaining the shipment of 10,000 units in the first half of next year (see page 25).
