Session III: Nuclear Energy: Policy and Politics

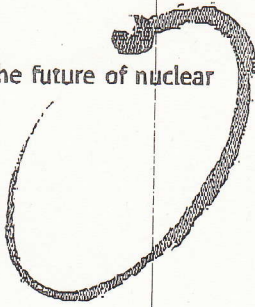
8:30 a.m. - 11:30 a.m.

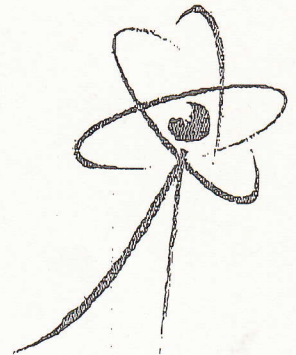
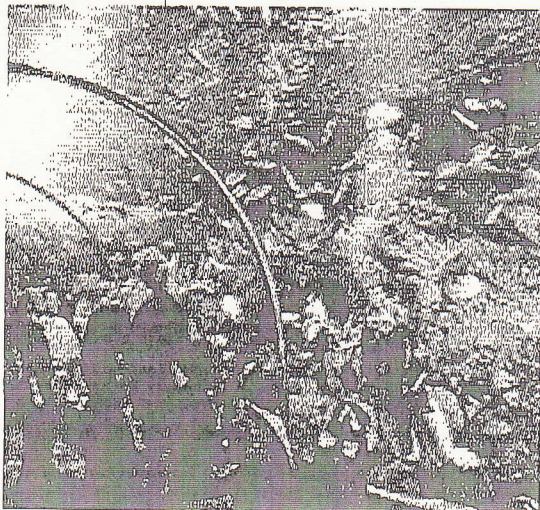
